As a SOJO lacrosse player you should be striving to become a better person every day using the principles above. Every time our lacrosse family gets together, we should have fun, strengthen our relationships, and improve our lacrosse skills.

You will be held <u>ACCOUNTABLE</u> for your actions in life and lacrosse is no different. The young men who work hard and stay focused will be rewarded with opportunities on the field. When we are on the field we will <u>HONOR</u> the game. We do this by going hard "in between the lines" and always give our very best effort. Being able to do that either on a field, in a classroom, at work, etc. requires <u>DEDICATION</u>. It is very important to dedicate yourself to the task at hand, whatever that may be. Never give up. Teammates will help us fight on when the battle seems overwhelming.

Using **TEAMWORK**, we can accomplish goals that may seem impossible to a single person. Always be supportive of your family, lacrosse brothers, and classmates. SOJO Lacrosse Club Grade Policy

In order to be eligible for play in SOJO Lacrosse, players must meet a minimum GPA requirement of 2.5. Grades will be checked as follows:

For fall lacrosse, grades will be checked in the middle of September.

For spring lacrosse, grades will be checked on the first day of practice and regularly during the season.

If a player is below the 2.5 GPA requirement, they will not be able to participate in games until their GPA has reached the required 2.5 GPA. They will be able to provide proof at the next grade check. If a player falls below the GPA requirement at grade check, grades will be checked every 2 weeks thereafter in order to determine eligibility. Grades will not be checked on a game-to-game basis. If the GPA is below 2.5, it is an automatic 2 week game suspension until grades are checked again. If the player's GPA falls below a 2.0, the player will be suspended from games and practices until their GPA returns to the required 2.5 GPA.

Any special circumstances must be filed with the SOJO Lacrosse board for review. The board will then pass the information on to the Utah High School Lacrosse League. UHSLL must sign off on any exceptions to the grade policy.
